- Implications of the new FSA's macro-prudential approach.
- What changing the scope of regulation will mean.

Andrew Whittaker, General Counsel to the FSA Board, will speak on Changes to the UK and European regulatory architecture.

The lecture is aimed at in-house and private practice financial services lawyers. The Turner Review is primarily focused on the regulation of credit institutions, although it raises questions of wider relevance to the financial services industry.
